The Oregon Fire Service Honor Guard was established in 1998. The team falls directly under the auspices of the Oregon Fire Chief's Association (OFCA). The Oregon Fire Service Honor Guard is represented by fire service professionals from across the State of Oregon. <u>All members volunteer their own time and their own expenses</u> to provide honors to the fallen throughout the state and on occasion out of state when requested and available. The Oregon Fire Service Honor Guard provides 3 levels of honor for funeral and memorial services for the qualified members of the fire service. These 3 levels consist of Line of Duty, Active duty, and Retiree deaths.

The Oregon Fire Service Honor Guard is a non-profit 501 c3 organization solely supported by donations. Donations are graciously accepted in any amount. The funds received are used to purchase items the team uses to provide the services offered. Some of the most important items are American flags that are meticulously folded and given to the families of the fallen, challenge coins that are only presented to the families of the fallen, flags, bases and axes for our colors postings, and bells for memorial remembrances.

The Oregon Fire Service Honor Guard, in partnership with the Oregon Department of Public Safety Standards and Training is responsible for the annual ceremonies at the Oregon Fallen Firefighter's Memorial located in Salem. Every year, a ceremony is held in honor of those whose names are forever inscribed on the granite wall. Those that have fallen to the ultimate sacrifice in the line of duty. Family and friends of the fallen are always welcome to gather, remember and celebrate their memories.

How to Activate the OFSHG

<u>ALL</u> requests for the Oregon Fire Service Honor Guard shall be made by contacting either the OFCA office or the State Commander. These requests MUST come from the current Oregon Fire Chief from the affected agency, NOT the family or a religious representative. The State Commander shall determine whether the request meets the criteria for activation and what the appropriate level of honor will be. The Honor Guard will never self activate.

Activations:

Events in order of priority, appropriate for activation of the Oregon Fire Service Honor Guard:

- Line of Duty death of Oregon Fire Service Personnel
- Active Duty death of Oregon Fire Service Personnel
- Retiree death of Oregon Fire Service Personnel
- Memorial Events
- State or National needs deemed necessary by the OFCA.
- Other activities approved by the State Commander

*** The team is all volunteer and in the case of no available members, the State Commander may have to decline the event.

The "Levels of Honor" Service protocol (below) will be used to determine appropriateness for all levels of funeral and memorial events. These protocols have been approved by the OFCA Board and are very specific to each level. They will be the standard guideline in the planning process. The State Commander will maintain the levels of honor for each event as appropriate and will not deviate from the protocols.

When to contact...

Please contact the Honor Guard State Commander AS SOON AS POSSIBLE!

We are here as a resource to assist in the many planning stages after a death. We can discuss all the levels of planning a funeral and provide guidance and other resources for your agency. We are able to plan over the phone, email and virtually. If there is a need to be in person, we may also be able to facilitate that.

The family of the fallen is the highest priority in our planning. Having direct contact with them through ONE family liaison from the beginning can only improve the outcome for everyone. The planning and honors must be approved by the family first. They have the final approval of all honors, NOT the Fire Department.



LEVELS OF HONOR SERVICE GUIDELINE FOR OREGON FIREFIGHTERS

General: As of January 2024, similar documents prior to this date are outdated and will not apply.

This guideline defines 3 different levels of honor with corresponding suggested arrangement options as approved by the Oregon Fire Chief's Association.

The Oregon Fire Service Honor Guard (OFSHG) will follow the below protocols. If the department insists on providing services which are above the approved protocols, the Oregon Fire Service Honor Guard may assist with planning to ensure proper etiquette but <u>will not</u> participate in that portion of the event. This should be avoided at all costs.

The OFSHG is a well versed resource and is willing to be involved in as much or as little as the department and family needs and/or wants regarding funeral planning and coordinating. We work side by side with the family's wishes. We will only do as much or as little as the family desires to the best of our abilities and limitations. It is ultimately what the family wants NOT the fire department. The OFSHG has very specific protocols to follow depending on the levels of honor that are applicable. The Oregon Fire Chief's Association has approved these protocols and we will not deviate from them. This ensures standardization across the state.

Who qualifies for Honor Guard Services:

An affiliated active Oregon firefighter or fire prevention specialist (career or volunteer) who is or was Oregon DPSST certified or affiliated.

How to Activate the Honor Guard:

The Oregon Fire Service Honor Guard can ONLY BE REQUESTED by the affected agency's Fire Chief, NOT the family or a religious representative.

The Fire Chief must either contact the OFSHG directly or go through the OFCA. The Fire Chief must be in full support and be willing to coordinate with both, the OFSHG and the family in the planning and organization of the event. The affected agency may be financially responsible for any related costs. Any financial donation to the OFSHG is graciously accepted.

Definitions:

Line of Duty Death, (LODD)

A firefighter on duty with an Oregon fire agency (career or volunteer) whose death is the result of an injury suffered in the line of duty. It may also be the result of an injury or illness that has been proven to be attributable to the job.

Active Duty Death

An active firefighter with an Oregon fire agency (career or volunteer), who dies off duty and is NOT determined as a Line of duty death.

Retired member Death

A retired firefighter of an Oregon fire agency.
